Everyone will soon be in a hurry to deal with the final clean up of their yards before winter sets in yet again. Residents have a few different options to dispose of their yard debris including leaves, branches, garden waste and general yard debris.

The DPW will be doing one more curbside brush pickup for the year; additionally you can drop off items at the yard waste site. Please see the information under *Upcoming Events*.

THE DPW DOES NOT DO CURBSIDE LEAF PICKUP, please do not place items in curbs and ditches as this causes stormwater backups.

Recycling Event to Be Held

October 29th from 9-11 am at the DPW shop

The state of Wisconsin passed a bill in 2009 that prohibited depositing electronic wastes in landfills. Since that time the Village of Palmyra made efforts to supply residents with opportunities to dispose of the electronic wastes. Again recently the E-Waste game has changed! Sources that have help fund the recycling of electronics through the state and federal government have been eliminated for 2016.

Through past efforts made on E-Waste recycling and the resulting success, Jefferson County Clean Sweep has partnered with the Village to host an event in the Village of Palmyra for county residents to dispose of a number of items.

On October 29th Jefferson County Clean Sweep will be hosting a recycling event at the DPW shop (203 Jefferson St. - *also known as Hwy E*) from 9 - 11 a.m. Items that will be accepted include electronics, appliances and lawn equipment.

All gas and oil must be removed prior to drop offs. Residents will be responsible to pay the hosting company for electronics as follows:

- Cathode Ray Tube, Console & Projections TV's - \$20 each
- All other TV's - \$10 each
- All monitors - \$5 each
- All other electronics, appliances and lawn equipment will be FREE

Residents will be able to pay with Cash and Check; No Credit Card payments will be accepted.

...that the Village of Palmyra is offering solutions for residents to dispose of their medications? The Palmyra Public Safety Building located at 126 N. First St. is offering a secure drop off location accepting personal and pet medications during normal business hours. Items can be dropped off in the lobby and do not have to be in prescription containers but can simply be put in a zip lock bag. **PLEASE DO NOT BRING IN LIQUID MEDICATIONS, SHARPS OR BIOHAZARD PRODUCTS.**

Spotlight: Sewer Main Cleaning - A Deeper Look

In the last edition of *Life in the Works*, we discussed the reasons for the Department's efforts to perform cleaning maintenance of the collection system. Since that time DPW staff has been out and about throughout the collection system performing root, grease and debris removal. During our activities staff retrieved a substantial obstruction from a section of sewer main along N. Second St. Although it may not be a real pretty thing to think about, this is the reality of our infrastructure and much of the system that is owned by residents. The portion of roots that was cut free was approximately 32" long and 6" in diameter! That may not seem like much, but in a pipe that is only 8" in diameter - it is a quick example of what one year can do.



This brings to light an even more important topic for homeowners - the same non-stop growth of tree roots is happening in and around your home's sewer lateral. It is an important thing to keep in mind, especially if you notice that you are getting water around basement floor drains during heavy water use. You may be months or even days away from your sewer lateral completely backing up. It is good preventative maintenance to have your sewer line cleaned out to ensure trouble free service and a long service life. We recommend that customers pay a little bit extra to have contracted services that can not only clean, but televise your service. That way when issues are experienced, you will be able to see what exactly the issue is to be able to make the best decision going forward. How To Protect Your Sewer Service, Your Neighbor's & The Sewer Utility

RAGS, RAGS, GO AWAY - THESE ARE THINGS TO THROW AWAY....

A few years ago the staff of the DPW noticed a big increase in the amount of rags and towel-like products that were being removed from the sanitary sewer collection system to eliminate clogged pumps and valves. The marketing push from companies on their products for household and personal use that were “flushable” was definitely working! The DPW circulated direct mailers to areas that were most problematic and POOF! – problem solved.

As a friendly reminder to customers, we would like to once again bring the discussion to light. Products that are “flushable” definitely are, but what they are not is pumpable or degradable and definitely NOT hygienic or sanitary when DPW staff has to remove them from the sewer system.

In the future, please keep in mind: there are only three things that should be flushed, everything else is garbage and should be put there.

Road Construction Projects

Royal Lee, Industrial, Wisconsin & Little

For 2016 the Village planned for two different road projects to be completed during the season. The maintenance work that has been completed to date included a slag chip seal application to a number of street segments in and around the Downtown Business District and the Industrial Park including Jefferson St., Main St., Taft St., Mill Rd., S. 2nd St. and N. 1st St. as well as Royal Lee Dr. and Future Rd.

The second part of the road work for this year includes paving work on Little St., E. Wisconsin St., Industrial Blvd. and Royal Lee Dr. The latter of the streets will have performed a 2” surface milling, asphaltic wedge and surface layer installed. Little St. and E. Wisconsin St. are scheduled to have full depth pulverization of the existing roadway and grading followed by the installation of the base and surface layers of asphalt.

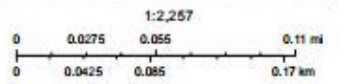
Work for the paving projects is currently scheduled to begin the week of August 22nd and to be completed by the end of the week of August 29th. Start dates and completion times of these projects will be weather dependent. Short term closures will be required to complete the projects so please be aware of signage and workers if in the area during the project.

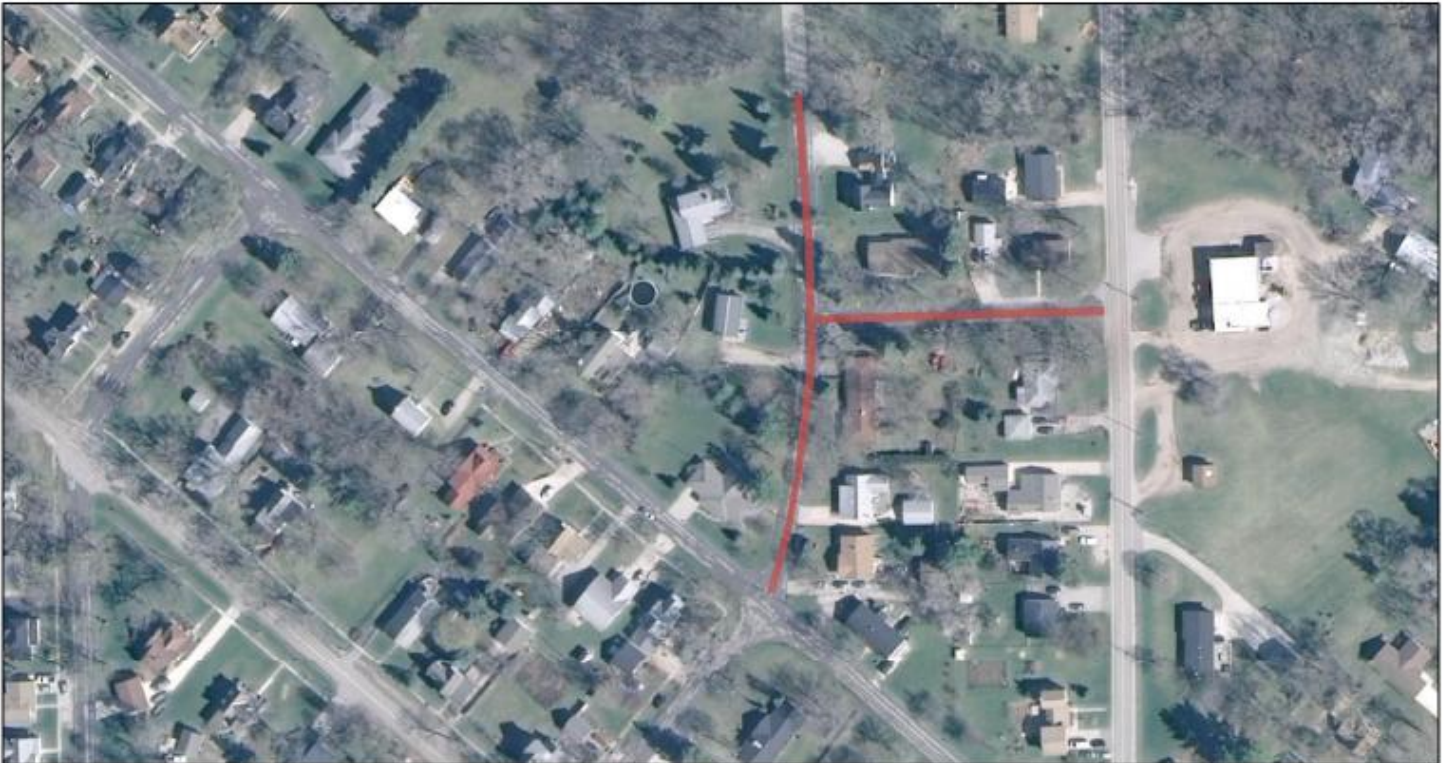
2016 Paving: Royal Lee Dr. - Industrial Blvd.



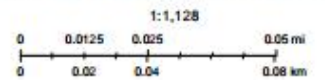

Spotlight: Sewer Main Cleaning

The DPW performs routine maintenance to the sanitary sewer collection system on an ongoing basis, but performs one specific activity on an annually. To keep the 11 miles of our gravity sewer mains free from roots, silt and other debris that may collect over a year, we use our jet-vac truck to remove these unwanted items from the system. During this maintenance, you will notice our crew working throughout different areas of the Village cleaning main lines. You may also notice a bit of a smelly area around where crews are working. This is a normal result from

scouring the inside of the mains and should dissipate relatively quickly. Additionally, this work can create a vacuum on the main line being worked on and may result in quick pressure changes on a building's sewer lateral as our jetting equipment passes by the connection point.

We recommend customers to keep lids down on toilets during the work and also to keep an eye on floor drains, sinks and shower traps to ensure they remain full of water and continue to keep your building safe.
